MI-07 Poll: Barrett Gaining Steam as Election Day Nears

Barrett outpaces Hertel in this pivotal swing district.


- Despite massive spending against him, Barrett has surged with less than four weeks to go. He is marching toward 50% ballot share and taking a 4-point lead over Hertel.
- Independents have shifted 8 points toward Barrett, giving him a 5-point advantage with these voters.
- Inflation and the economy (24%) and illegal immigration (17%) rank among voters top three issues, and Barrett is dominating those who prioritize them by 65%+.
- Barrett now leads in all three media markets, including the expensive Detroit media market.

- Back in mid-October 2022, Barrett trailed Slotkin by 3 points (Barrett 44 Slotkin 47).
- Barrett was down 22 points with Independents at this point two years ago he's now sitting 27-points better with this group.
- Barret's margin among a key group—non-college-educated voters—has climbed seven points, going from Barrett +19 two years ago around this same time to Barrett +26 today.
- Barrett's stronger 2024 position is also **powered by more solid backing from his base**, up from 87% of Republicans in mid-October 2022 to 94% now.

BOTTOM LINE: While Barrett is stronger positioned to win this election cycle, **he'll need resources to overcome the massive Democratic spending**.

Methodology: This probabilistic survey was conducted October 6-8, with 405 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of ±4.85%. Likely general election voters were interviewed via live phone calls and SMS text-to-web. This survey was weighted to a 2024 likely general election universe.
